At this time, the CERCCC Joint ETSB and South West Cook County have not submitted an agreement regarding the transfer and reporting of surcharge funds attributable to the Village of Forest View. Since the Village of Forest View previously had its own ETSB, any hold harmless funds attributable to Forest View should be transferred to CERCCC once the transfer of surcharge agreement is filed with the ISP. Wireless surcharge will be transferred to CERCCC once a wireless plan adding Forest View is filed and approved by the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator.

Conclusions:

This plan modification opts the Village of Forest View into CERCCC from the South West Cook County ETSB. The South West Cook County ETSB has also filed a plan modification requesting to opt the Village of Forest View out of its 9-1-1 system to CERCCC. Both CERCCC's and South West Cook County ETSB's service populations will remain above 25,000 in their respective 9-1-1 systems, therefore meeting the requirement to serve a minimum population of at least 25,000 pursuant to Section 15.4a, 2) of the ETSA. This plan modification also meets the requirements for a modified plan filing under Illinois Administrative Code Part 1325.205. The hold harmless amount attributable to the Village of Forest View should not be transferred to CERCCC until the transfer of surcharge agreement is filed with the ISP. The wireless surcharge attributable to Forest View should be transferred to CERCCC once a wireless plan adding Forest View is filed and approved by the Statewide 9-1-1 Administrator.
